Prior Lake-Savage Area Schools (PLSAS) can expect more than 2,100 additional students over the next ten years spread across all grade levels (2017/18 - 2026/27).

As a result, a long-term facilities planning process is underway, led by a 50-member community Task Force that is providing input to address our needs.

Between now and 2025, about 24.2 million Americans are expected to complete an education beyond high school, whether a college degree, certificate, or industry certification. That is about 16.4 million Americans shy of what’s needed to fill jobs demanding higher skill levels.


