PLSAS Staff and Families,

District leaders have been closely monitoring COVID-19 data and staffing rates this week. We are seeing an increase in positive COVID-19 cases. While we have implemented the shortened quarantine option for 5 days for staff, we continue to experience critical staffing shortages based on increased employee absences combined with a growing number of job vacancies throughout our district. As a result, **Distance Learning will continue through Friday**, **January 21**. We will continue to monitor our data, and should the staffing levels support it, **it is our intention to return to In-Person Learning beginning Monday**, **January 24**. Families and staff will be notified next Thursday evening if this needs to be altered.

Please continue reporting student absences due to illness, including positive COVID-19 cases, to your child's school during Distance Learning.

K-12 Building access for students during Distance Learning Jan. 19-21

If absolutely necessary, students can come to school during Distance Learning. **Due to our staffing limitations**, parents/guardians should only use this option if it is absolutely necessary for their student to be supervised and/or access internet resources. There will not be in-person, teacher-led instruction provided at the school; the teacher-led instruction will continue to be provided online only but students will be supervised. Bus service will be available to students who are registered utilizing the below link. All center-based programs will follow regular building and student hours. Please continue to report absences through our attendance line.

Early Learning Programs:

Circle of Friends Preschool, ECFE and ECSE will return to regularly scheduled in-person classes on Wednesday, January 19. Please continue to report absences through our attendance line.

*Regular transportation will be provided for students in the above listed Special Education center based programs and ECSE.

PLSAS LakerMarketplace will continue to offer free, curbside Meals-to-Go during Distance Learning. Curbside meals will be 3 days worth of free breakfast and lunches available for pickup on Friday, January 21 from 10 a.m.-12 p.m. at three locations.

Substitute Teach: To be a substitute teacher, an individual would need to get a short-call substitute license and apply through Teachers On Call. Click here for information.
