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### Survey results are in

Thank you to those who took part in our annual survey. The following are highlight summaries of the results.

#### Parent Survey

- **94%** of parents said adults/teachers believe my child can learn and be successful
- **96%** of parents indicated that their child's school is clean and well maintained.
- **87%** of parents said they believe their child's school is safe and secure.
- **93%** of parents feel respected at their child's school.
- **89%** of parents said their child likes to go to school.

#### Student Surveys

- **98%** of elementary students and **89%** of secondary students feel safe and secure in school.
- **96%** of elementary students and **83%** of secondary students feel connected to at least one adult at their school.
- **97%** of elementary students and **88%** of secondary students say adults/teachers in their building have high expectations for them.
- **94%** of elementary students and **93%** of secondary students said their teachers use technology to help them learn.

#### Staff Surveys

- **97%** of Certified Staff\* and **93%** of Educational Support Staff\*\* said they are aware of how to implement Lockdown with Options procedures.
- **95%** of Certified Staff and **93%** of Educational Support Staff said they work in a building/department with high expectations.
- **94%** of Certified Staff and **98%** of Educational Support Staff said they are proud to be associated with PLSAS and its brand.
- **91%** of Certified Staff and **95%** of Educational Support Staff said they work in an environment that respects diversity and is discrimination free.

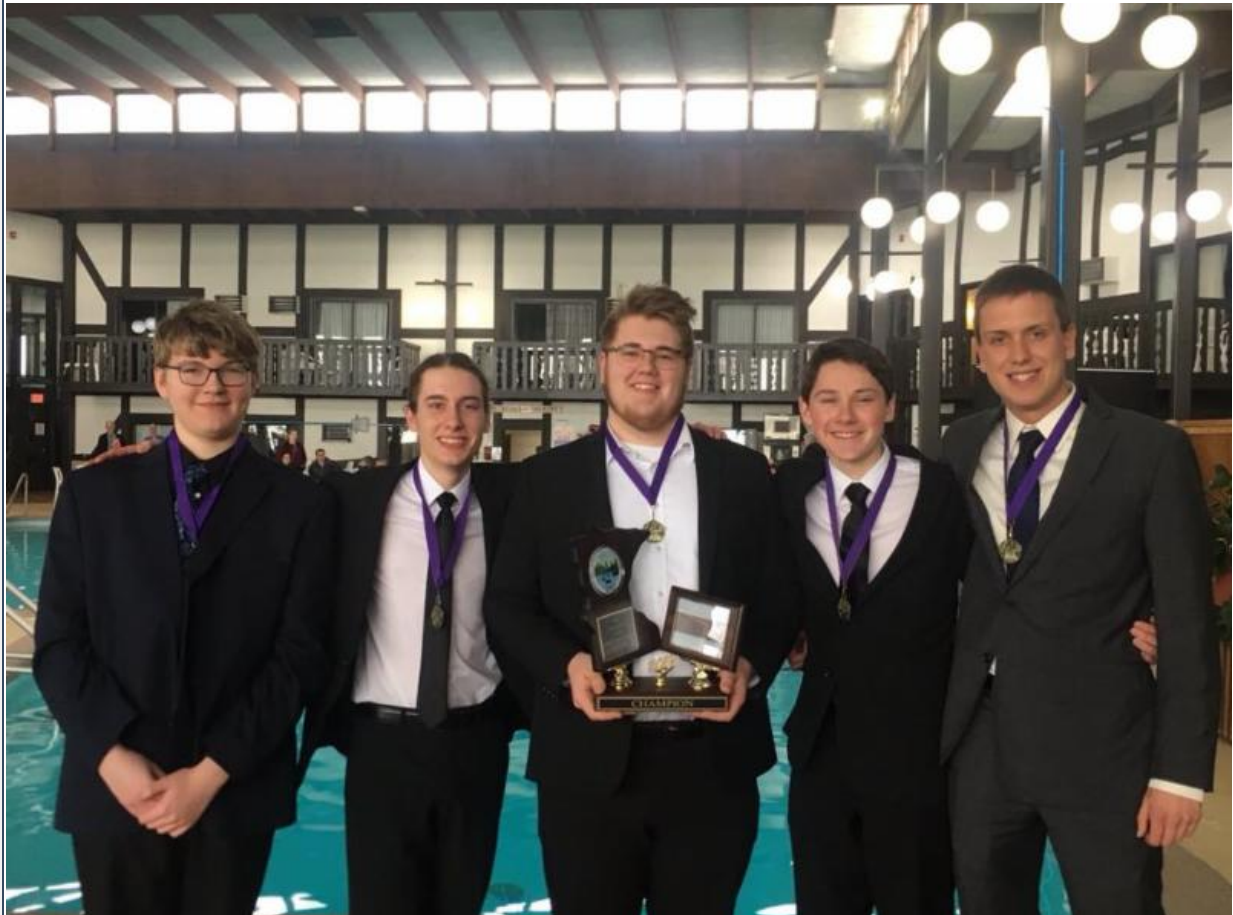

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### **School Board reviews K-5 boundary change recommendations**

The School Board formally reviewed K-5 attendance boundary map options B1 and C1 for consideration last Monday. The recommendations were brought forward after months of planning and included feedback from an input team. On Monday the Board listened to dozens of comments and feedback from residents who attended the Study Session.

The Board will hold a Study Session on May 6 at 5:30 p.m., directly before its regular board meeting, to discuss next steps prior to taking action on elementary boundary changes.
