School Board approves Redtail Ridge and WestWood boundary changes for 2018/19

On March 26, the School Board approved 2018/19 boundary changes for Redtail Ridge and WestWood elementary schools. Approximately 60 Redtail Ridge students and approximately 16 WestWood students will attend Glendale Elementary in the fall of 2018.

This decision was made to help ease crowding at Redtail Ridge and WestWood and make enrollment more equitable across the grade levels.

A process to determine comprehensive elementary boundary changes will be made prior to the opening of the new elementary school and will include stakeholder involvement.

PLHS students read self-authored books to elementary students

Environmental Science students from Prior Lake High School (PLHS) visited fifth graders at Glendale Elementary to share children's books they wrote and illustrated, about endangered species.

Prior to their visit, the high school students visited the Minnesota Zoo for a behind-the-scenes tour where they learned about different endangered species. They chose an animal to research and compiled their findings into a children's book with illustrations or photographs.

At Glendale, PLHS students each read their book to a group of fifth graders who took notes and asked questions. The fifth graders' task was to find out five facts about the endangered

species presented.

The books were gifted to Glendale, so students can continue to read and learn about endangered species while remembering their special visit from the high school students.



Shark Tank simulation pushes middle school students to dream bigger

Students at Hidden Oaks and Twin Oaks Middle Schools participated in Shark Tank-style presentations as a part of their math curriculum. Students were assigned a group and tasked with thinking of a new invention or product and creating a basic business model for it.

Each group pitched their product to a panel of “sharks,” which are adult volunteers from the middle schools and the district. The students ask sharks to invest a specified amount of money; whatever it would take to make their product a success. The sharks listen to the pitch, ask questions and decide whether they will invest, counter-offer or decline the pitch, similar to the TV series.

Of course, the products and the money being invested are hypothetical, but the students must do the math to come up with a number that would make sense in the real world and some groups even created prototypes.

Students also created a business model including plans for advertising and marketing their products.



E-STEM: PLHS students learn how to make syrup

The arrival of spring brings a special environmental learning opportunity to students at Prior Lake High School (PLHS). Several weeks ago, students began tapping sugar maple trees on the PLHS campus, with the help of Science Teacher, Sam Steinberg and District Naturalist, Sue Mohn.

They collected the sap once a day from about 15 trees on the PLHS campus. On March 28, the processing began. The sap collected was cooked down on an evaporator built by Industrial Technology Teacher, Joe Deutsch.


Classes were invited outside to see the evaporation process and hike to the tapped trees, learning about sap, maple syrup and even about Native American tradition.

Elementary students throughout Prior Lake-Savage Area Schools also learned about sap harvesting—several trees at elementary schools throughout the district were recently tapped as well.
