Minor Offense

First Offense:

Reteach/discuss
desired behavior

Second Offense:

Student takes break,
Reteach/discuss

Third Offense:

Teacher contacts
home, formal
behavior referral

Fourth Offense:

Send to Student
Services

Minor Offense

- Accidental property damage
- Dishonesty
- Disruption to learning
- Parking without permission
- Electronic devices: inappropriate use
- Public display of affection
- Insubordination
- Loss of personal control
- Mistreatment of others
- Plagiarism/Cheating
- Presence in unauthorized area
- Rough-housing
- Tardy/Leaving Early
- Unexcused absence from class
- Inappropriate use of language

Major Offense

- Offensive language or gestures
- Alcohol or drug possession
- Arson
- Bullying/Harassment
- Dishonesty
- Electronic device: inappropriate use
- Inappropriate sexual behavior
- Insubordination
- Physical aggression
- Plagiarism/Cheating
- Theft
- Threat
- Chemical use and/or possession
- Vandalism
- Weapons Possession

Major Offense

Teacher:

Makes behavior
referral, student goes
to Student Services

Student Services:

1. Reteach desired
behavior
2. Consequence is
given
3. Parent/guardian
is notified

Student Services
records in Infinite
Campus

At any time during the consequences process, it is acceptable to make an office referral at the discretion of the teacher.

Repeated minor offenses may result in additional consequences
